Health Information Exchange (HIE).

The same type of information may be found in more than one place, for example, medications may be found in:

- **GP Reports** section (this section holds all the information received from the GP)
- Medications section (like most sections, this may contain information from several trusts/providers).
- Discharge summaries in the Clinical Correspondence section may also include medications information.

The **notifications button** will provide useful information about new data available, incidents or planned downtime.

**Filters** and **page search** can be used to look for specific words. Remember to use the **Reset** button each time you finish using these functions.

Information is grouped into **sections**. These can be expanded or collapsed using the arrows in the top corner. Sections may have more than one tab and multiple pages. **Drag and drop** sections into the order you would like them to appear on the screen.

Hover over or click on a line to see more detail about an entry.

The **Source** column tells you which organisation contributed the information.

The Shared Care Record is a read-only, real-time summary of selected data. The amount of information available will differ between organisations and increase over time. It is not the full record for an individual.
